


A Quality Exceptional Student Education Program ensures the success of all students in an environment of trust, respect, and open communication.

The Transition Academy

The Transition Academy Program is an option as determined by the IEP. for those students who may choose to defer their regular diploma. Located on the campus of the Withlacoochee Technical College, it provides instruction in functional academics and employability skills. Students may also enroll in career education or job preparatory classes or participate in an off-campus work program and Community Based Instruction Trips. In addition to providing direct instruction students, the ESE (Exceptional Student Education) teacher supports other participating faculty and employers.

Students will have the opportunity to participate in a comprehensive program that will teach the skills to be successful in a variety of careers that include but not limited to:

This program is based on a student centered model. Students will spend some time each day in a classroom setting, working on a basic vocational curriculum introducing workplace terminology and positive work maturity skills.
